ICERREAKERS AND TEAM BUILDERS TO BUILD COMMUNITY

OBJECTIVES

- To practice encouraging and supporting one another
- To assess the connection between how we feel and how we learn

MATERIALS

- Download PAPER
 HAT INSTRUCTIONS
 HANDOUT A AND
 B from BUILDING
 INTENTIONAL
 COMMUNITIES.COM.
 Make one copy
 for every pair of
 participants in your
 group.
- Paper plates
- · Pens

SETUP

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Divide participants into two groups.
- 2. Distribute paper plates and a marker to each participant.
- 3. Explain to participants that they will engage in a drawing challenge over two rounds.
- 4. For the **first round**, one person in each pair will **volunteer** to be the **prawer** and the other will be the **reader**.
- 5. **Distribute PAPER HAT INSTRUCTIONS HANDOUT A** to each reader.
- **6.** Explain that the **READER will read off a set of instructions** from their handout.
- The DRAWER will place their paper plate on top of their head and draw according to the READER'S instructions.
- 8. When they are finished, ask participants to **remove** their paper plates from their heads and **look** at their masterpieces.

Paper-Plate Hat Tricks continued

- Ask the pair to work together and use the scoring matrix on the handout to score the first drawing.
- **10.** After tallying the score, partners should **switch roles**.
- 11. Distribute PAPER HAT
 DRAWING INSTRUCTIONS
 HANDOUT B to the new
 READER.
- Ask pairs to repeat the process.

DEBRIEF

- What did you like about this activity?
- There were two types of scoring questions on the matrix—what were they?
- How were the types of scoring different?
- How is your work impacted by your beliefs, attitude, and other people's encouragement?
- What are some things you can tell yourself when you are working on something challenging?
