Team Résumé

Activities to Build Trust

OBJECTIVES

- To identify and articulate one's own positive attributes
- To identify collective strengths
- To practice thinking and writing as a group

MATERIALS

- Download from **BUILDING INTENTIONAL COMMUNITIES.COM**:
- TEAM RÉSUMÉ
 TEMPLATE (one copy for each group of four to six participants)
- PERSONAL

 QUALITIES CARDS

 (make three sets and cut them out)
- Index cards
- Pens and pencils

SETUP

 Eliminate any cards you feel won't resonate for your group.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. **Distribute an index card and a pen** to each participant.
- 2. **Spread** around the **PERSONAL QUALITIES** CARDS on the floor of the room.
- Ask each participant to walk around the room and select up to three cards they feel represent some of the best qualities they bring to the group.
- 4. Have each participant find a partner.
- 5. Have partners work in pairs and share with each other two of the cards they chose; ask them to share one thing that wasn't on a card (e.g., "I'm a great speller"; "I'm never afraid to ask questions"; "I stand up for others"; etc_. Have them write these on their index card.

- 6. Next, have each pair merge with two other pairs to create groups of six. (If you already have workgroups formed have, ask them to do this with their assigned group rather than in random pairings.)
- Explain that each group will now create a Team Résumé.
- 8. Explain that this will allow the groups to focus on collective strengths by brainstorming collective values and using

- personal and professional characteristics to define the **strength of the group**.
- 9. Distribute the TEAM
 RÉSUMÉ TEMPLATE and give
 participants fifteen to twenty
 minutes to fill it out.
- 10. Call, "Time," and ask each group to report back and share their team strengths by saying, "We can," rather than, "I can."

DEBRIEF

- What was most challenging about this activity?
- What did you like about this activity?
- What was it like to work together as a team?
- Did your team divide up roles or responsibilities?
- · What was your role?
- What did it feel like to speak for the whole group?
